Rev. Mr. George Edward McMahon, 70, of Morgan Dr., Morganton, NC died Wednesday, February 15, 2007 following a period of declining health. He was born in Ridgeway, PA on December 28, 1936 and was a son of the late Edward Michael McMahon and Catherine Mary Stangel McMahon.
