Sherrill Allen Lytle, 64, of Morganton was called home to rest in the arms of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, on Thursday, October 4, 2018 after a period of declining health. Born in Burke County, NC on July 15, 1954, he was the youngest of the eight children of Juanita Garrison Lytle and the late Norman Lytle, Sr. Sherrill loved and shared a special relationship with them. He was lovingly referred to as "Sherrill Baby" by his mother and known to his family and friends as "Sherrill the Pearl" because of his love for playing basketball. Before his failing health, Mr. Lytle was known for his sharp mind, strong leadership skills, and friendliness.
