Together they had 3 children, 3 grandchildren, and 1 great grandchild. Carolyn is survived by her husband Denton, children Mark Emery and James Emery, sisters Elizabeth Roos and Helen Brantley, grandchildren Jacob Standafer, Connor Emery and Alex Emery, and great grandchild Hudson Standafer. She was preceded in death by her parents and son, David Emery.

Mrs. Emery was a lifelong servant of Jesus Christ and was an active member for many years at First Presbyterian Church of Morganton, NC. She sang regularly in the choir and loved the music ministry. Among her other interests were a passion for reading, children, Duke basketball, and especially travel with her husband
