Charles Daniel (Danny) Bass was born November 2, 1948. He passed away at the age of 75 on August 2, 2024. Danny resided in Morganton, NC since 2002 after having lived at various times in Matthews, Charlotte, Denver, and Raleigh, NC, as well as Tampa, FL.

Danny was born to Charles Samuel and Polly Lingle Plyer Bass. He attended East Mecklenburg High School. Danny married the love of his life Elaine Woodie on September 17, 1967 before being drafted and serving in the Vietnam Conflict. As part of his service to the United States in Vietnam, Danny was an infantry soldier and worked with his unit to clear mines from the battlefield. Danny worked for North Carolina National Bank (NCSB) which became Bank of America where he finished his career as a Senior Vice President, retiring in 2002. During the time his three girls were at home, Danny could be found at the softball field either coaching, or on the sidelines cheering—always his girls' biggest fan.
