With a heart as big as the sky and a love for the Carolina Tarheels and the Atlanta Braves that rivaled any superfan, Don Blanton slid into his next adventure on September 7, 2023. Those close to him suspect he's now discussing basketball with his beloved coach Dean Smith and throwing the ceremonial first pitch for the Braves up in the great beyond.

Don came into the world in Boiling Springs, North Carolina on July 28th, 1943, and from an early age, he exhibited a penchant for soaring – both in the skies with the Air Force and in his passion for life. After a decorated career in the Air Force, where he was awarded the Meritorious Service Medal, Commendation Medal, Achievement Medal, National Defense Medal, and many others, he comfortably retired his wings but never his spirit and love for the country he loved so much.

He began his next journey in life managing Bi-Lo Grocery Stores where he truly enjoyed meeting many new faces and being a positive influence to everyone around him. He retired from Bi-Lo after twenty years of service.

While he was fiercely proud of his Air Force blues, come game day, Don's true colors shone through: Tarheels' blue and Braves' red. His family recalls with fondness the many times he'd say, "Yes Sir!" when his boys made a clutch basket to win the game.

Don leaves behind a legacy of love, laughter, and a large collection of Tarheel memorabilia and bald eagles. He is survived by his devoted wife of 58 years, Rita; his beloved daughters, Denise (Jason) and Michelle (Stephen); a band of grandchildren, Tina, Jacob, Zachary, Madisen, Tristan, Nigel, and Allena, and great-grandchildren Griffin, Scarlett, and Magnolia. And let's not forget Tank, the family dog who, like Don, had a severe dislike for Blue Devils or Wolfpacks.

The family welcomes all to a celebration of Don's grand slam of a life on Saturday, September 23rd at Sossoman Funeral Home.
