Gray "Pop" Riddick passed away July 28, 2024. He was born in Linthicum, MD, on February 8, 1941. He attended the Severn School and graduated from the University for Maryland and was a member of Delta Tau Delta fraternity.

Gray began his professional career with DuPont in 1964 (6 days post-graduation). His career with DuPont took the family to Virginia, Delaware, New York, Texas, and North Carolina before his retirement in 1996. Gray's "second half" involved serving his community both through leadership positions with Habitat for Humanity and more volunteer roles than you could count in Davidson, Chocowinity, and Morganton.

A man of strong faith, he was very active member of many churches, serving as an Elder, Deacon, and on numerous committees focused on both the spiritual and business needs of his congregations.
