Jane Crouch, 92, of Morganton, NC was called to her Heavenly home on December, 31, 2023. She was born on January 2, 1931 in Guilford County to the late George Washington Stephens and Mary Richardson Stephens. As a devoted member of First United Methodist Church of Morganton for over 70 years, Jane served in many capacities, including 3rd grade Sunday school teacher, youth counselor, member of the Board of Churches, member of the committee to organize a young adult Sunday School, President, Teacher, and active member of the Aldersgate Sunday School Class for 65 years, President of the UMC Women, and Chair of the Bereavement Committee. Jane also served as Regent and Vice-Regent of the Quaker Meadows chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution, Treasurer of the Jr. Women's Club, Lt. Governor of Ladies Optimist Club of Western N.C. District, a Grace Hospital volunteer, and member of the Pilot Club.

Jane worked for the Burke County Department of Social Services for 32 years as an administrative assistant, retiring in 1994. She grew up in Wilmington, NC but moved to Durant, OK after the 9th grade where she finished high school and completed college courses at Southeastern Teachers College.
