Reverend Joseph Lynn Curtis, 69, an Elder in Full Connection in the South Carolina Annual Conference, passed away on September 25, 2022. He was the son of the late Tillman Joseph (T.J.) Curtis and Billie Pons Curtis, was born on May 15, 1953 at Fort Clayton Army Hospital, United States Canal Zone, Panama, and was raised in Glen Alpine, NC. Joseph was the grandson of the late Joe Ben and Grace Kelly Curtis and the late Maude Jones Pons. He was baptized and confirmed at Glen Alpine Methodist Church.

He received his education in the Burke County School District and graduated from Glen Alpine High School, with honors, in 1971. He attended the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, Western Piedmont Community College, and Appalachian State University, where he received a Bachelor of Science degree.

Joseph went on to serve as an ordained Elder in the South Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church, serving 7 congregations across the state. In 2017, he returned from retirement to serve his eighth congregation.
