Steve Woody, 75, of Morganton, NC, transitioned peacefully to his Heavenly home on Sunday, September 15, 2024 while surrounded by his family.

Born in Burke County, NC on March 21, 1949, he was the son of the late Frank Junior Woody and Frances Perkins Woody.

He served in the US Air Force and was a true patriot.

Steve loved his church, Pleasant Ridge Baptist Church, where he was a member for 46 years. He served as a deacon, Sunday school teacher, and was the chairman of the Mission Team to which he devoted a lot of his time. Along with his church, the South Mountain Christian Camp was very close to his heart. Steve volunteered many hours there on a variety of projects. This included events all over the southeast, which produced hundreds of wins and a couple championships. He retired from Dana Corporation and later bought and restored his beloved 1930 Chevrolet, of which he was very proud.
