An avid hunter and fisherman who hunted big-game in the western states, he was in the Sportsman's Hall of Fame for killing a record-size North American elk. After retiring from Broughton Hospital, he wrote a genealogy book entitled "Grandfather Community."

Ted is survived by his wife of 67 years, Agnes Preswood Shook of the home; children, Jerry Dean Shook and wife, Judy, of Lexington, Garry Theodore Shook and wife, Beth, of Newport, NC, and Judy Ann Langley and husband, Mike, of Lexington; ten grandchildren; and six great-grandchildren.
